Planning permission for residential use granted in 1991 and extended, but work not started. 1990 14 February 2012 Private Flint deterioration (peeling from brick core), particularly bad to South elevation. Severe brick deterioration to west window. Numerous sills dropped. Low level graffiti, but also graffiti to north side of tower.
