# RYA Recognised Training Centre

As an RYA recognised training centre we are able to offer a range of courses taught by qualified and experienced RYA instructors. The courses are based at the Foreshore office in Bracklesham Bay, they run from March to November and are available to all.

Our unique location at Bracklesham allows access to the quieter waters of Chichester harbour and the open waters of the Solent with nearby Portsmouth and the Isle of Wight allowing you to learn in a variety of marine conditions.

We have two Avon 5.4m Searider rigid inflatable boats (RIBS) fitted with twin 40hp Yamaha engines launched from our own slipway directly outside the training centre.



## Course Content

### Powerboat level 2 (2 days)

Our most popular course, no experience necessary. We provide lifejackets and waterproofs or you can bring your own. The course covers launching and recovery, close quarters boat handling, high speed manoeuvres, anchoring, basic navigation and gps usage, man overboard and collision regulations.

By the end of the course you will be able to handle a powerboat in familiar waters by day. Upon completion of this course you can also apply for your International Certificate of Competence (ICC) which is often required if you intend to hire out powerboats abroad.

### Intermediate (2 days)

Daytime navigation skills, passage planning, use of plotting instruments, GPS and electronic navigation.

By the end of the course you will be able to navigate a powerboat on coastal passages by day.

### Instructors Course (4 days)

Entry requirements: Applicants must have completed a pre-entry assessment and hold the RYA powerboat Level 2 (Coastal), hold a current First Aid certificate and membership of the RYA.

The course consists of two days training and assessment, on the final day by an independent moderator.

### RYA First Aid (1 Day)

Course covers all basic first aid subjects from a boating perspective; it is aimed at anyone who goes afloat whether on inland waters, rivers, estuaries or cross-channel passages.

### VHF Marine Radio (1 day training and exam or online course and exam only)

This course is the minimum qualification required by law to control the operation of VHF and VHF(DSC) equipment on any British-flagged vessel fitted with radio, fixed or handheld. It covers basic operation, correct channel usage, emergency procedures, Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacons (EPIRB), digital selective calling (DSC) and routine voice procedures. In order to complete the training and exam in 1 day you are required to do some pre-learning.
