Thank you for your email dated 31/07/2015 things are now becoming a lot clearer however there are a few things that are still confusing me. CDC maintains that there is headroom of 770 but looking at the EA letter from, Ms Hannah Hyland to CDC and included in WwTW Position Statement she states:

"The modelling demonstrated that the additional nitrogen discharged through the storm overflow when a flow of 385 m₃/day is added to the WwTW would have an insignificant impact on weed growth. In discussion with Natural England we have agreed that this headroom could be made available for development that would be occupied once the UV treatment is operational.

A volumetric headroom of 385 m₃/day equates to approximately 700 dwellings. We would recommend that you have discussions with Southern Water as to how you monitor any planning permission granted."

It has to be noted that on recent planning application 700 is the number that is being quoted by Southern Water as being available? It seems I'm not alone in being confused by the headroom numbers.

I assume that CDC or some other authoritative body have been monitoring planning permission granted from 2006 and will have monitoring tables that can confirm these headroom numbers are available? I have tried to find these tables online, but to date I have not had any success and I wonder if you would be so kind as to supply me with these tables or point me in the right direction so I may source them for myself.
