I would easily bet that the developers grew up enjoying green spaces, fields, grass and trees... why is it that our children shouldn't be allowed the same opportunity? Why shouldn't our children be able to live and see green grass, space and fields... My two boys [REDACTED] adore the outdoors – we have a nature camera that we often set up in the woods behind our estate – it records overnight and we love looking to see what animals we have recorded – in one single night we will easily see 3-4 different deer, squirrels, hedgehogs and much more. This is at the absolute cost of the animals, plants, trees that have made Chichester harbour and this surrounding area their home – there must be a better way to build housing, a better place to build housing, one that isn't at the cost of nature.
